Translating good intent into lasting solutions

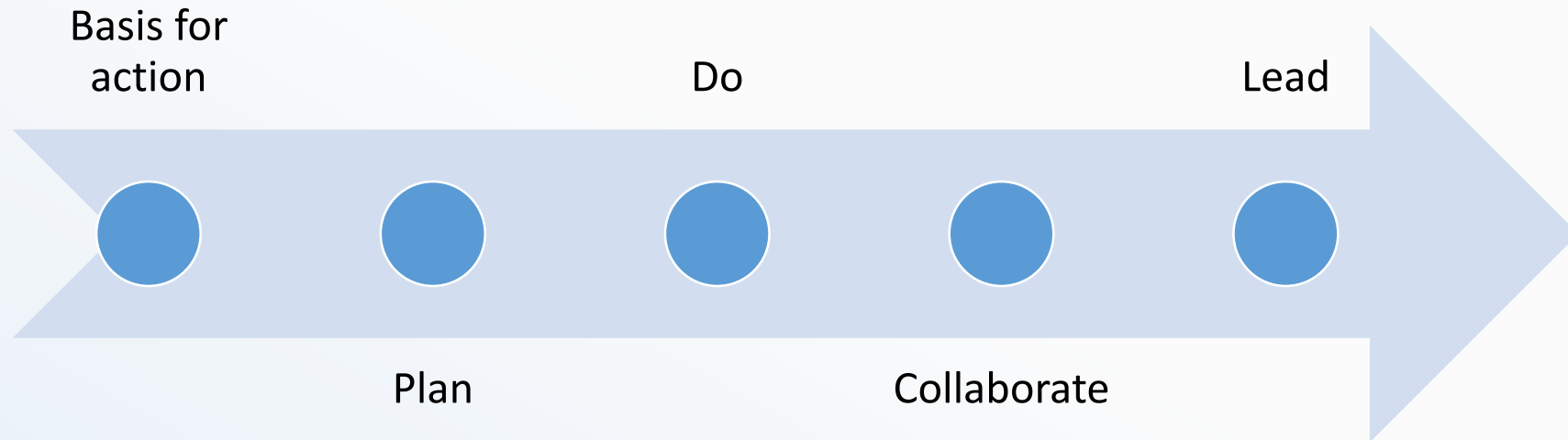
- Framework to implement or improve WASH practices
- Catalyze collective action around SDG 6 and WASH access



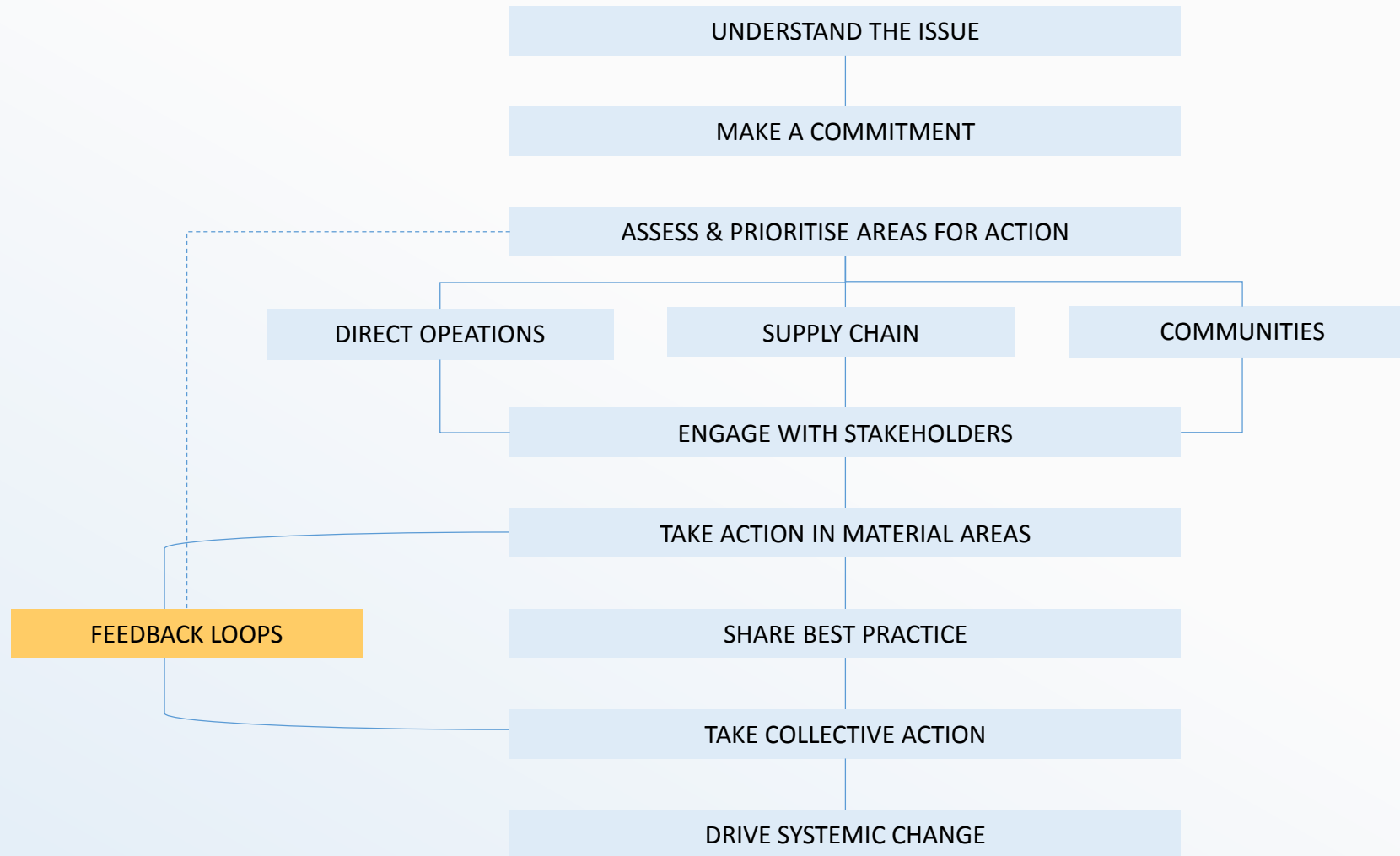
Using the framework

- Each step – series of considerations and support material

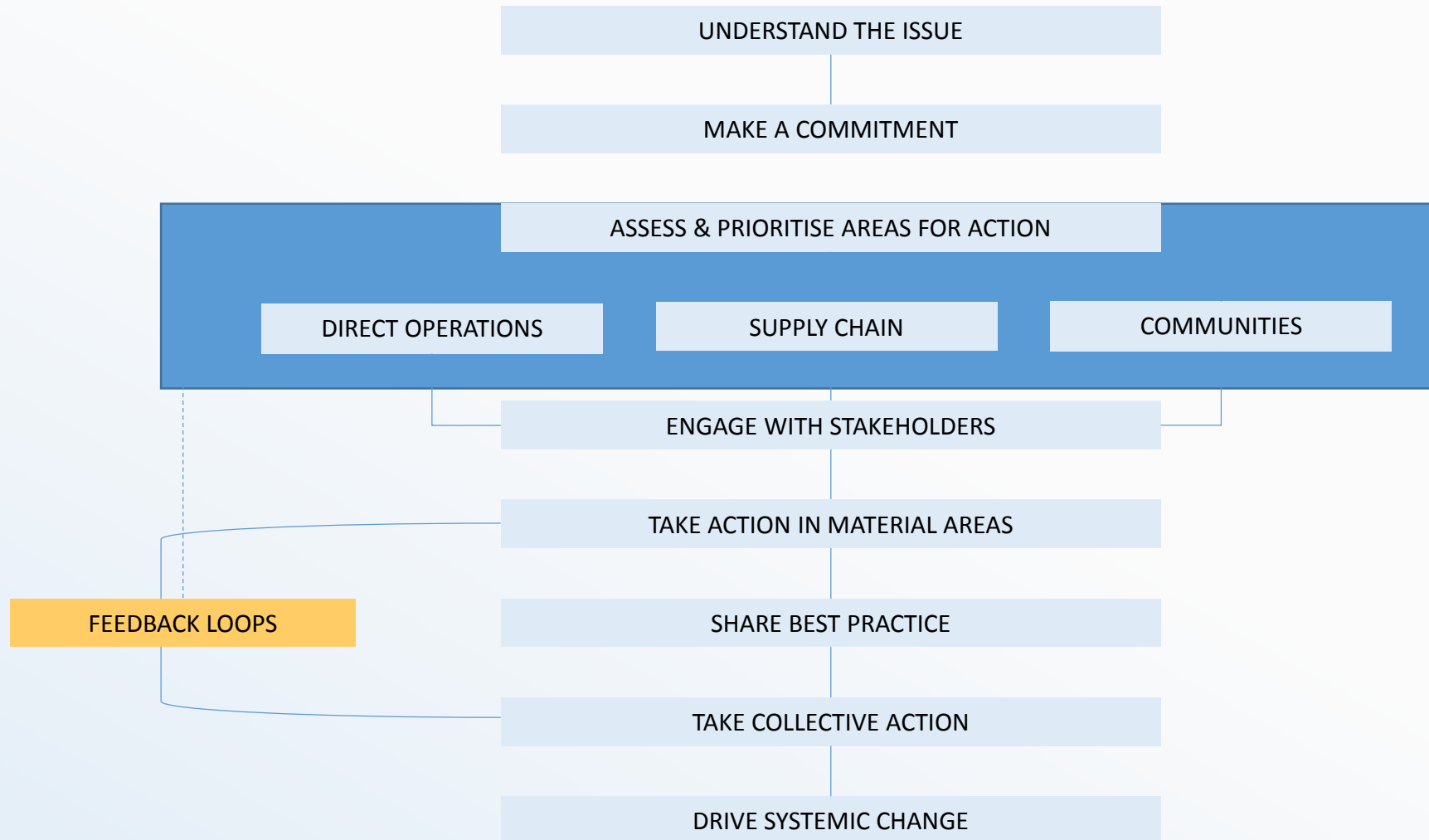
Framework for Action: An Overview



Framework for Action: Snapshot



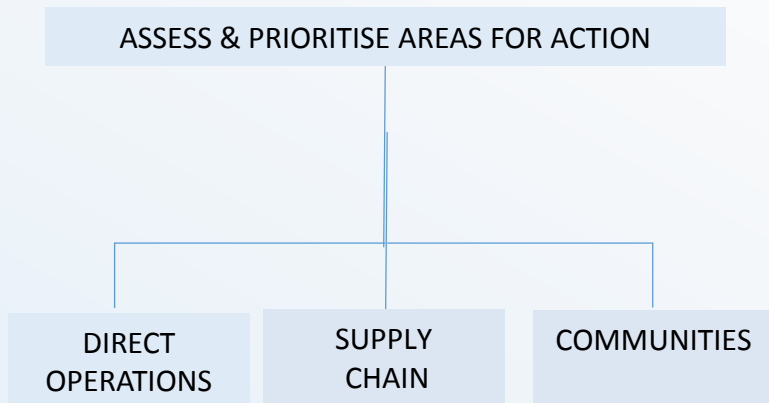
